

## Video Transcript:

CARL: Mr. Davis told me that his tongue swelled after he ate some shellfish. He also said that he's been coughing and has nasal congestion. I did see some signs of dyspnea because he started to wheeze a lot. I administered 25 milligrams of diphenhydramine via IV bolus for itching. But now he says he's can't seem to catch his breath, so I'm starting to think that maybe he is having a reaction to the contrast dye from the catheterization.

KAREN: Is Mr. Davis showing any other cardiac or respiratory manifestations?

CARL: I am really concerned about his breathing. I had to apply a non rebreather face mask, and I increased his oxygen supply to 15 liters per minute because he was showing intermittent stridor. But his oximeter is still reading only 87%. His skin has started to turn ashen, his nail beds are dusky. He has stridor, and he's distressed. So I will continue to watch for difficulty swallowing, too. I called his provider for further orders and the rapid response team. They're here now.
