## APA Citation Examples

Based on the 6th edition of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*

### Format of "References" Page

Citations should be double-spaced, formatted with a 1/2" hanging indent, and alphabetized by the first word, usually the author's last name. If no author name is given, alphabetize by the first word in the title.

### Print Sources

#### Book:

Format	Author last name, Initials. (Publication year). <i>Book title: Subtitle.</i> Place of publication: Publisher name.
One Author:	Kenny, D. T. (2011). <i>The psychology of music performance anxiety.</i> Oxford: Oxford University Press.
Two Or More Authors:	Rudman, L. A. & Glick, P. (2008). <i>The social psychology of gender: How power and intimacy shape gender relations.</i> New York: Guilford.
An Editor:	Stitt-Gohdes, W. L. (Ed.). (2012). <i>Trends and issues in business.</i> Reston, VA: National Business Education Association.

Examples

#### Article from a Book:

Format	Article author last name, Initials. (Publication year). Article title. In Editor's Initials. Last name (Ed.), <i>Title of book</i> (pages). Publisher location: Publisher name.
Work in an Anthology:	Burns, J. M. (1995). The crisis of leadership. In T. J. Wren (Ed.), <i>The leadership companion: Insights on leadership through the ages</i> (pp. 37-92). New York: Free Press.
Article in an Encyclopedia:	Plank, S. (1999). Hildegard of Bingen. In A. Commire (Ed.), <i>Women in world history: A biographical encyclopedia</i> (Vol. 7, pp. 205-221). Waterford, CT: Yorkin Publications.

#### Article from a Newspaper, Magazine or Journal

Format	Author last name, Initials. (Publication year, date). Article title. <i>Publication title, volume (issue), pages.</i>
Newspaper	Chang, K. (2009, July 21). Is the sun missing its spots? <i>New York Times (Late ed.)</i> , pp. D1, D3.
Magazine	Kantrowitz, B., & Underwood, A. (1999, Nov 22). Dyslexia and the new science of reading. <i>Newsweek</i> , 134, 72-78.
Journal	Cissik, J. M. (2007). Strategies for teaching changes in direction. <i>Strength and Conditioning Journal</i> , 29 (4), 29-31.

### Internet and Electronic Sources

#### Web Sites:

Format	Author last name, Initials. (Date, or n.d. if no date available). Title of document [format if applicable, i.e. newspaper article, blog post, etc.]. Retrieved from URL
Example (no author):	Kaiser Health News. (2009, July 23). Rural Americans and the unemployed struggle to get adequate health insurance. Retrieved from <a href="http://www.kaiserhealthnews.org/Daily-Reports/2009/July/23/Rural-America.aspx">http://www.kaiserhealthnews.org/Daily-Reports/2009/July/23/Rural-America.aspx</a>

### Journal Article from a Database:

<b>Format</b>	<b>Author last name, Initials. (Publication year). Article title. <i>Journal Title</i>, volume(issue), pages. DOI if available <a href="http://dx.doi.org/xx.xxx/yyyy">http://dx.doi.org/xx.xxx/yyyy</a></b>
<b>Example:</b>	Jordan, A. B. (2010). Children's television viewing and childhood obesity. <i>Pediatric Annals</i> , 39(9), 569-73. doi: <a href="http://dx.doi.org/10.3928/00904481-20100825-08">http://dx.doi.org/10.3928/00904481-20100825-08</a>

### Article in an Online Encyclopedia:

<b>Format</b>	<b>Author last name, Initials. (Publication year). Article title. In <i>Title of Encyclopedia</i> (volume number). Retrieved from Database name OR URL.</b>
<b>Example:</b>	Selin, N. E. (2010). Wind power. In <i>Encyclopaedia Britannica Online</i> . Retrieved from <a href="http://britannica.com">http://britannica.com</a> .

### Newspaper or Magazine Article in a Database:

<b>Format</b>	<b>Author last name, Initials. (Publication year, month, day). Title of article. <i>Publication Title</i>, volume(number), pages. DOI if available.</b>
<b>Magazine Article in a Database:</b>	Grunwald, M. (2013, July 22). Beyond the Keystone Pipeline. <i>Time</i> , 182(4), 22.
<b>No Author:</b>	College learning for the new global century: A report from the national leadership council for liberal education and America's promise. (2007). <i>Liberal Education</i> , 93(1), 36-43.

Examples

### E-Book:

<b>Format</b>	<b>Author last name, Initials. (Publication year). <i>Title of book</i>. Publisher location: Publisher name. DOI if available OR Retrieved from <i>Database name OR URL</i></b>
<b>Example:</b>	Gotz, G. (2012). <i>Global change: Interviews with leading climate scientists</i> . New York: Springer. Retrieved from <i>Springer Ebooks</i> .
