<p>Outline & Initial Video Response</p>	<p>25 to >20 pts Exceeds Expectations Student completes all sections of Case Study Outline. Explanations are in-depth and provide details. Responses are relevant and demonstrate understanding of content. Initial video response summarizes Case Study Outline and does not exceed 2 minutes. Student presents outline well throughout video.</p>	<p>20 to >15 pts Meets Expectations Student shares Case Study Outline and responses show understanding of content. Explanation or details may be lacking in depth. Student shares initial video response, but does not summarize the Case Study outline well. Explanation can be improved to summarize the outline.</p>	<p>15 to >0 pts Needs Improvement Student shares Case Study Outline, but content is missing or content displays a lack of understanding. Student does not provide in-depth responses. Student shares initial video response, but response is either too detailed or too vague; demonstrates lack of explanation or comprehension of topics.</p>	<p>0 pts Below Expectations Student does not share a Case Study Outline nor video response.</p>	<p>25 pts</p>
<p>Video Replies to Classmates</p>	<p>5 to >2.5 pts Exceeds Expectations Student replies with a video response to at least 2 classmates. Replies help to further the class discussion. Video responses do not exceed 1 minute.</p>	<p>2.5 to >0 pts Needs Improvement Student only replies to one classmate; or student replies to two classmates, but video responses do not help to further the discussions (such as replies of "good job" or "I agree with you," etc.).</p>		<p>0 pts Below Expectations Student does not share video replies to classmates.</p>	<p>5 pts</p>
