

Book Club ESL 87

We are reading *Enrique's Journey* this semester. For this book, we will have book club meetings every week while we are reading the book. Your group will have no more than five people in it. Each time we meet, you will need to:

1. have read the chapter we are working on,
2. be ready to discuss the chapter
3. lead a discussion of the chapter two times.

When you lead a discussion, you will need to do the following:

1. Prepare five thought-provoking questions. Think of open-ended questions that are specific to certain portions of the chapter. Avoid questions with "yes" or "no" answers. Instead, make "wh" questions, like who, what, when, where, why, how, etc. Your questions could be about characters, setting, plot (actions and action), symbols, etc.
2. Find a golden line from the chapter you are leading. Discuss its relevance to you. Ask the group to do the same.

Tips!

3. As the discussion-group leader, try to keep the conversation on course. Maintain a friendly atmosphere, but keep everyone focused on the matter at hand.
4. Remember that this is a discussion, not a lecture. Use your position as leader to pose the questions and guide the group when participation is lacking, but allow each member the chance to speak
