The protection of human subjects in research is paramount to any research effort. Research that involves human subjects is highly regulated by federal, state, and institutional policies and requirements. protection is extended to almost every type of research that involves people, even survey research. The purpose of this chapter is to provide historical context, explain the federal regulations that govern research involving humans, to clarify the authority of the institutional review board (IRB), and to address the responsibilities of investigators conducting research using human subjects.
