Breaking the Culture of Silence

The culture of silence among the students in the US schools prevents effective prevention of a potential school shooting. It was common for students to ignore any remark about some criminal plans to remain silent because snitching was considered an uncool behavior even when it could potentially save lives. However, the 1999 Columbine massacre helped change the students' perceptions making them willing to report any security issue to the resource officer, their parents or their teachers (How To Prevent School Shootings - The Boston Globe N.p). As a result, some planned school massacres including the New Bedford and Marshfield have been averted. Although most classmates knew that Nikolas Cruz was fascinated with guns and violence, no one reported such behavior to the relevant authorities to avert any impending problem (Ray Sanchez N.p). Therefore, all the school stakeholders should do anything possible to ensure that reporting a threatening behavior becomes socially acceptable among the students.

However, giving excessive

television coverage to the incidences of the school shooting and other criminal activities results in the copycat phenomenon where other potential criminals are motivated to execute their plans in different locations. For instances, most students who attacked their classmates in 1999 were influenced by the activities of the Columbine massacre (How To Prevent School Shootings - The Boston Globe (N.p)). Therefore, the extensive media coverage of the previous school shootings might have also motivated Cruz to kill his schoolmates.

Reinstate the ban on Assault Weapons ← ?

It makes common sense to reduce the accessibility of semi-automatic rifles because they have been used in most school shootings. Reinstating the ban on assault weapon will ensure that such weapons do not reach the hands of troubled people suffering from various mental and psychological problems. Nikolas Cruz suffered from a psychological condition because his mother was dead, he had no good relationship with the family that took him in, and he had been expelled from the school (Ray Sanchez (N.p)).

the increasing rate of school shooting crimes in the US is primarily caused by bullying and other psychological factors. The case of Nikolas Cruz indicates that psychological factors also play a significant role. After being expelled from school, Cruz was motivated to revenge by executing mass killings in the school compound. Given his violent behavior and the obsession with guns, Cruz should have been identified as a risky person who should not be allowed to have access to guns.
