Five pages means five pages, not four and a half. You can divide the paper however you wish, but each topic must have a minimum of one page. So for instance you may write a paper with four pages about Quantitative Easing and one page on Negative Interest Rates. That would be perfectly acceptable. You will need a minimum of five outside sources. You will each be called on to make a 10 minute presentation. The margins, font, etc are the same for this paper as for the the short papers.
