Concepts to Know

- ✓ **Counterclaim** - a position taken by someone with an opposing viewpoint
- ✓ **Causal Argument** - argue that something has caused something else
- ✓ **Evaluation Argument** - an argumentative evaluation of something as "good" or "bad," but you need to establish the criteria for "good" or "bad"
- ✓ **Proposal Argument** - propose a solution to a problem
- ✓ **Narrative Argument** - you make your case by telling a story with a clear point related to your argument
- ✓ **Rebuttal Argument** - build your case around refuting an idea or ideas that have come before
- ✓ **Definition Argument** - a definition as the starting point for making your case
