

Lab Report Guidelines

- Must be written in English
- Must use proper grammar and punctuation
- All words spelled correctly
- Always refer to actions in past tense
- Do not use pronouns or the names of persons
- Do not use "run-on sentences"

Lab Report Guidelines

- Do not write procedures like an instruction manual
- All numerical info must have units
- All tables must be numbered and labeled, e.g. Table 1, Density Data
- All graphs must be numbered and labeled, e.g., Figure 2, Stress vs Strain
- All tables and graphs must include proper labeling

Lab Report Guidelines

- In general, tables and graphs should be discussed in the body of your report
- Reports must be able to be read by another person familiar with the subject. Must be concise and logical.
- Don't assume that the reader is familiar with your material. Make the report accurate, complete and understandable
