Purpose: The goal of this informative speech is to introduce to the class a well-known public speaker and focus on explaining his or her speaking attributes and qualities. You will choose a person from the list provided and use that person as the focus for your speech. There will be no duplication of topics.

Objective: This speech should be an original effort to explain to the class what made (or makes) this person so good at public speaking. Focus on describing their speaking skills and the qualities they possess that make them so effective. **DO NOT** provide a bibliography. Follow the speech organizational pattern: Introduction, Body, Conclusion. Due to time constraints, this informative speech should contain no more than three main points.

Visual Requirements: A short video clip (no more than 45 seconds) must be integrated into the speech as an example of the speakers abilities.

Oral Citation Requirements: You must orally cite at least 2 credible, external sources in the speech.

Outline Requirements: Submit the outline to the Dropbox in D2L the day of your speech BEFORE the start of class. Late submissions will not be accepted. No exceptions.

- Outline must be 10-12 point size, Times New Roman font, 1-inch margins. Use the template provided in D2L to ensure you use the correct format.
- A reference page is required and is the last page of the outline. Do not attach as a separate document. It is to be formatted in MLA or APA style.
- If you would like feedback on your outline prior to submitting it for a grade, email me the rough draft *at least 48 hours* prior to the day of your speech. Attach the outline as a WORD doc file (.doc, .docx, .rtf). Name the file LASTNAMEFIRSTINITIAL_SPEECH2_ROUGH.doc (e.g. FURLONGJ_SPEECH2_ROUGH.doc). I will only accept attachments sent from your official school email. Do not send me the rough draft in the body of the email.

Delivery Instructions:

- You may use a timer, but make sure any alarms are set to silent.
- The speech is to be delivered extemporaneously from notecards.
