Final Project Part Two is the creation of a practical experience reflection. Throughout the course, you have been assigned journal activities to help you reflect on your practical experience and to consider the impact the experience has on your future work in the field. The journal assignments will help you develop the key deliverables for your final project.

In this assignment, you will demonstrate your mastery of the following course outcome:

- PHE-680-03: Assess personal progress in attaining project goals within a public health setting

Final Project Part Two is not divided into milestones, but you will use the reflective journal exercises completed in Modules Two, Four, Six, and Eight to ensure a quality final submission. The final project will be submitted in **Module Nine**.

Prompt

In this part of the final project, you will reflect on your experiences. Specifically, you must address the **critical elements** listed below. Most of the critical elements align with a particular course outcome (shown in brackets).

I. Reflection

- A. Reflect on your practical experience.** In your response, consider how the opportunities, barriers, work responsibilities, work culture, and challenges influenced your perspective of the public health field. [PHE-680-03]
- B. Explain the effectiveness of the methods used to develop your project plan.** Provide specific information about challenges and opportunities you experienced during the development of your Methods section and competency selection process. [PHE-680-03]
- C. Assess your participation in the practical experience thus far for informing your future work in the field.** Provide specific examples to illustrate your response. [PHE-680-03]

Final Project Part Two Rubric

Guidelines for Submission: Your practical experience reflection must be 2 to 3 pages in length and must be written in APA format. Use double spacing, 12-point Times New Roman font, and one-inch margins.
