If you plan to submit your project electronically, save your written project in electronic format in one of the following formats: .doc, .docx, .rtf.
2. Create a product brochure that is designed to sell the product you choose by comparing it with other products. (Remember that you need to give credit for any pictures you use as well as the product information.)
3. Create an audio or video presentation. If you are submitting a video file, save it in one of the following formats: avi, wmv, mov, MP4. If you are creating an audio file, save it in one of the following formats: mp3 or wav. If you choose to create an audio or video presentation, you will need to submit your resources in print.
