

EXTRA CREDIT

Extra Credit is completely optional; it is an opportunity for any student wishing to maintain or increase his/her academic standing in the class. It is also insurance against damage caused by a less than "stellar" performance on the Final Examination.

You may apply 5 points of extra Credit toward any of the course assignments, including the final, for each Out-of-Class evaluation you complete.

The report must evaluate a live speaker in a formal setting. The speakers might include, but are not limited to, a professional speaker at a public forum, a speaker on campus, a guest speaker or employee at work, a pastor, rabbi, minister, or any other religious counselor delivering a message, or a teacher or professor in the classroom. Please note that it is not as valuable to evaluate a speaker on tape or live television because the evaluator usually fails to get a sense of how the audience is responding.

1. GENERAL END:
Is the purpose of the speech to inform, to persuade, or to entertain?
2. SPECIFIC PURPOSE:
The speaker is attempting to inform/persuade/entertain about what?
3. OCCASION:
Why did this audience convene to hear the speaker?
4. TYPE OF AUDIENCE:
Students, faculty, workers, artists, etc.?
5. BEGINNING AND ENDING:
Be Specific.
