FORMATTING THE WORKS CITED PAGE

FILMS OR MOVIES NOT ON DVD WITH THE DIRECTOR NAMED FIRST, ACTORS NOT NAMED

Director. *Movie title in italics*. Studio, release date. Publication medium.

Lucas, George, dir. *Star Wars Episode IV: A New Hope*. Twentieth Century Fox, 1977.

Film.

FILMS OR MOVIES NOT ON DVD WITH THE MOVIE TITLE NAMED FIRST, DIRECTORS AND ACTORS NAMED

Movie title in italics. Director. Major actors. Writers. Name the studio, release date.

Publication medium.

The Usual Suspects. Dir. Bryan Singer. Perf. Kevin Spacey, Gabriel Byrne, Chazz

Palminteri, Stephen Baldwin, and Benicio del Toro. Polygram, 1995. Film.

FILMS, DVDS, OR VIDEOCASSETTE

Ed Wood. Dir. Tim Burton. Perf. Johnny Depp, Martin Landau, Sarah Jessica Parker, Patricia Arquette. Touchstone, 1994. DVD.

Just replace "Film" with "DVD" or "Videocassette."

RECORDED TELEVISION EPISODES (E.G. DVD, VIDEOCASSETTE):

"Episode title in quotation marks." *TV show's name in italics*, season if available.

Writers and directors. Studio, distribution date. Publication medium.

"The One Where Chandler Can't Cry." *Friends: The Complete Sixth Season*. Writ.

Andrew Reich and Ted Cohen. Dir. Kevin Bright. Warner Brothers, 2004. DVD.

Note: Use your discretion when naming directors, writers, performers, producers between the title and the distributor.

Abbreviate *dir.*, *writ.*, *perf.*, *prod.*

MORE WORKS CITED PAGE FORMAT EXAMPLES

WORKS CITED PAGE FROM A WEBSITE

Author or editor. "Title in quotes." *Website name in italics*. Name of (sponsor or publisher), publication date (if available). Publication medium. Access date.

WORKS CITED PAGE WEBSITE EXAMPLE, AUTHOR AND PUBLICATION DATE NAMED

Pidd, Stewart. "Paraphrase Rules." *Attackthetext.com*. Attack the Text Publishing, 12 Oct. 2010. Web. 13 Nov. 2013.

WORKS CITED PAGE WEBSITE WITHOUT AN AUTHOR NAMED OR THE PUBLICATION DATE

"Making Vegetarian Food Tasty by Adding Meat." *Carnivore.com*. Carnivour, n.d. Web. 24 Feb. 2012.

WORKS CITED PAGE WEBSITE WITHOUT AN AUTHOR OR THE PUBLICATION DATE NAMED

"How to Sleep." *eSleep*. N.p, n.d. Web. 24 Feb. 2010.

IN-TEXT CITATIONS REVIEW

When citing in text, use the first entry of the citation on your works cited page (First entry refers to the first thing that appears on the line for each entry, usually the author or the title of the work:

AUTHOR AS FIRST ENTRY, USING A QUOTATION

Works Cited page website example, author and publication date named

Pidd, Stewart. "Paraphrase Rules." *Attackthetext.com*. Attack the Text Publishing, 12 Oct. 2010. Web. 13 Nov. 2013.

The website lists many profound insights: "Paraphrasing is very difficult" (Pidd).

Title as first entry, using a paraphrase

The author describes her pet cow named T-Bone in great detail ("Making Vegetarian Food Tasty by Adding Meat").
