They started in room HR E on Mar 6, 2015 at 1:00 PM. The committee members were, Chair: Greenlick, Representative: Weidner, Representative: Lively, Representative: kannemer, Representative: Nosse, Representative: Hayden, Representative: keny- Guyer, Representative: Buehler, Representative: Clem and committee administration: Sandy Thiele and committee assistant: Mnia Daniel. They started with agenda HB 2234 and it was, Requires Oregon Health Authority and insurers offering policies or certificates of health insurance that reimburse costs of physician services to create billing codes or alternative mechanism to enable community assessment center to bill for child abuse medical assessment and related services. Action: Do pass as amended and be printed engrossed.

Second agenda HB 2307 it was, Prohibits mental health care professionals and social health professionals from providing any service to person under 18 years of age for purpose of attempting to change person's sexual orientation or gender identity. Action: Move it to Monday Mar 9, 2015.

Third agenda HB 2934 it was: Requires Oregon Health Authority to submit blueprint for basic health plan to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services by December 31, 2015.

Action: I think they move it.

Agenda HB 2931 it was: Directs Oregon Health Authority to disseminate to school districts information related to elevated levels of radon. Action: I think they cancel it

Agenda HB 2930 it was: Requires hospital to adopt rules granting admitting privileges to licensed, certified nurse midwife nurse practitioner. Action: I think they do not Except it.

Agenda HB 2600 it was: Requires continuation of group health insurance coverage for employee on family leave on same terms as when employee is not on leave. Action: I think they move it.

Agenda HB 2560 it was: Carried over from 3/4/15 agenda: requires health benefit plan to cover cost of colonoscopy for insured who is 50 years of age or older and who has positive fecal immunochemical test result. Action: Do pass as amended and be printed engrossed

Agenda HB 2825 it was: Carried over from 3/4/15 agenda: Requires Oregon Health

Authority to seek out and apply for funding for, and appropriates moneys from General Fund to
pay for, crisis intervention services and residential care for individuals with mental illness.

Action: Do pass with amendments, be printed engrossed and be referred to ways and
means by prior reference.
