

**Part 1:** (General Midterm Rules)

- Write only one sentence to answer each question unless otherwise stated. Use your own words; do not copy phrases from the article.
  - Your grade will be based on both grammar and the quality and detail of your answer. Correct sentence structure is very important: write within your ability.
  - You must include the italicized phrase in your answer; it may be anywhere in the sentence.
  - **Type each question and then your answer.**
1. Write a one-sentence summary of Henry's life *Henry, whose*
  2. Describe the meeting and Henry's behavior there. *the meeting where*
  3. Why did Henry remain at the meeting? *despite*
  4. Imagine a different life for Henry. (Use past unreal conditional.) *if*
  5. What happened to Gov? *due to.*
  6. How does the author feel about Fritchie? *Fritchie, who*
  7. Think about Lyle's comparison in the first two paragraphs. Then give your opinion and explain; maximum three sentences. Should Fritchie have been provided with euthanasia (the "Gentle Way to Die" that Lyle describes)? *(un)like*

**Part 2:** Write a summary of the article in **paragraph** form, four to six **numbered** sentences long. Use your own words and start with a main idea sentence as we have practiced. **Follow Blue Sheet rules.** On your midterm, your main idea sentence will receive its own grade as well as being considered part of the summary. Practice writing strong main idea sentences.
