

Paper 3 for EH 101: A Proposal

Purpose:

The major goal of this paper is to enhance your ability to write a paper that brings attention to a problem and proposes a logical and reasonable solution to that issue.

Task:

Your task is to call your audience's attention to a problem, propose a solution to that problem, present a justification for your solution with reasons and evidence, and defend it against objections or alternative solutions. See pages 391-392 in *A&B* for topic ideas.

It is important for you to consider who your audience is since you are writing your proposal specifically for that audience. Usually, your audience for a proposal is a person or people who have the power to make a change concerning your topic.

All of your essay should be based on your own knowledge, logic, and observation; therefore, there should be no outside sources used for this paper.

Format:

The final draft of the paper should be 800-1,000 words. Your paper must follow MLA guidelines (there is a sample MLA paper on pages 488-496 in *LB Brief*. This is the format that you should use for all of your college English papers). The paper should have a title centered between the header and the body of the paper.

Evaluation:

Your paper will be evaluated based on the Shared Criteria in *Resources for Composition* in the *LB Brief* and based on the methods of writing this paper as discussed in class and noted on this prompt.

Submission and Due Date:

The paper must be submitted to Turnitin.com by **Tuesday, June 23 at 1:00 pm**. Turnitin.com will automatically close at that time and any paper that has not been submitted will be considered late. *No excuses will be accepted for late papers.* If you miss the deadline to submit, consult with the instructor.
