The effects of using euphemism stated above are felt in making decisions. For instance, whenever a decision is supposed to be made of the offenses committed by a member of the society, toning down the offense will result in arriving at an unfair judgment and hence the decisions made from the case will be considered unethical. Sound decisions are made from considering the happenings as they occur and the cruelty of such actions should be described in their exact terms so that whenever a decision is made, the facts are considered and applied as they are, not as they are depicted because of the respect that the society needs in addressing some of the unpleasant topics. The use of euphemism reframes a situation, and this leads to misinterpretation. Whenever there is a misinterpretation, the meaning is lost, and a sound decision cannot be made. Immoral characters are molded this way, and unacceptable social characters come up in the society. Members of the society should not be shielded by the use of euphemism as others get hurt through their actions and poor and unethical decision-making processes (Sayers 221).

The same way euphemism can be used as a basis for decision-making, it also can be used as a way to justify and deny actions already taken. When an unethical deed already has occurred, euphemism acts as a shield to protect individuals from the psychological effects of those actions.

Instead of recognizing the possibility that the individual is unethical, it is used to deal with negative emotions for having committed a crime. Euphemism can be used to protect individuals from their role in having immoral actions and attempt to reduce their personal responsibility the action.
