

- 1) MLA Source information is complete
- 2) Has a paragraph summary (using your own wording) of the article with a topic sentence introducing the summary.
- 3) Has at least three quotations from the article that would be strong support or facts/statistics about the narrowed topic, specifically focusing on history of topic, causes, or effects. (Include page numbers)
- 4) Has a paraphrase of an important paragraph in the article that focuses on a specific cause or effect.
- 5) *Response discusses information in quotes and paraphrase and summary.* You should primarily be creating an analysis of how the information you found relates to the Causes/Effects discussed in your paper. You can indicate your *opinion* about the information in the article, but the primary focus of the Source Notes is to analyze Causes and Effects related to your topic. You should also discuss the importance of the information and its connection to your topic. (10 sentences)
