An active participant in workshops nationwide, Shaner received a Louis Comfort Tiffany Foundation award in 1963, and three National Endowment for the Arts craftsmanship awards in 1967, 1973, and 1978. He began exhibiting in 1964, and after dozens of group and one-person shows, was the subject of a touring retrospective exhibition. Shaner's works can be found at Arizona State University, Tempe; the Everson Museum of Art, Syracuse, New York; the Kansas City Art Institute, Missouri; and the Royal Ontario Museum, Toronto, Canada.
